

Public Transport (Getting Around Bilbao, Irun and Hendaye)

Bilbao

Public transport in Bilbao is highly developed:

- The metro is the main transport system and runs across the city.
- The tram can be used to connect the main areas of the city centre.
- The Bilbobus network serves all neighbourhoods of the city.

Euskalduna Conference Centre

- Metro (L1 or L2): get off at “San Mamés” station and walk for 3–5 minutes.
- Tram (Euskotran): “Euskalduna” stop.
- Bilbobus: several routes pass through the San Mamés and Abando areas.

Irun

Public transport in Irun is smaller in scale but very efficient:

- Urban bus services are available through DBUS and Lurraldebus.

FICOBA Exhibition Centre

- From Irun Railway Station (IRN): 10–15 minutes on foot.
- Lurraldebus bus (Donostia–Irun route): “Ficoba / Bentak” stop, 2 minutes on foot.
- Train (Euskotren / Renfe): “Irun Ficoba” station, one minute on foot.

Hendaye

Within Hendaye, most journeys are made on foot, as it is a small town and its main locations (railway station, town centre, beach and border crossing) are all very close to one another.

There is also the Txik Txak bus network, which serves Hendaye and nearby towns, although it is not commonly used for local travel within the town itself.

Borderline Fabrika

- Located within Hendaye railway station.
- Train: “Gare d’Hendaye” station; Borderline Fabrika is situated directly at the station.
- Bus (Txik Txak network): “Gare d’Hendaye” stop, one minute on foot.

IRUN – HENDAYE CONNECTION

- Irun ↔ Hendaye = 5–10 minutes on foot.

- Euskotren (train): direct connection between “Irun Ficoba” station and “Gare d’Hendaye” station.
- Lurraldebus + Txik Txak: integrated cross-border bus network.
